now stated that the following elements would make up the range of services:

- ***Assertive Mobile Youth Outreach Services (AMYOS) providing assessment and treatment for young people in the family home or community***
- ***Adolescent day program units providing a range of therapy options for young people with social difficulties and a history of school refusal/exclusion***
- ***Step Up / Step Down Units offering short-term residential treatment in partnership with non-government organisations in purpose-built facilities to enable early discharge from / prevent admission to acute inpatient units.***
- ***Residential rehabilitation units in a community setting delivered by a non-government organisation in partnership with mental health specialists to teach young people the personal skills they need to achieve and maintain independence and emotional well-being***
- ***Subacute beds for adolescents who require medium-term, intensive treatment and rehabilitation services in a hospital-based environment.***

with only the following noted on the [Queensland Health website](#) as currently available:

- ***A residential rehabilitation unit in south Brisbane***
- ***Subacute beds in the Mater Children's Hospital for extended treatment and rehabilitation, until the opening of the [Lady Cilento Children's Hospital](#) later in 2014***

and plans underway for:

- ***7 assertive mobile youth outreach service (AMYOS) teams to be located in north Brisbane, south Brisbane, Redcliffe/Caboolture, Logan, Gold Coast, Darling Downs, and Townsville.***
- ***An adolescent day program unit on the north side of Brisbane to complement existing units at the Mater Children's Hospital (south Brisbane), Toowoomba, and Townsville.***
